



The Henry G. Herzing Scholarship for Severely Injured Servicemembers

Despite federal-level discussions restricting benefits for injured veterans, Herzing University has created a scholarship program for wounded servicemembers to help defray the cost of the education and skills training required for entry into a new career, a cost often incurred as a result of their injuries.

On April 1, 2009, Herzing University Online will begin awarding the Henry G. Herzing Scholarship for Severely Injured Servicemembers in appreciation of their sacrifice for the U.S. and her citizens. Up to 12 servicemembers per year will be awarded the \$1,000 scholarship; recipients are encouraged to re-apply each year during their enrollment.

“As a veteran and proud American, I feel it is our responsibility to provide additional assistance and opportunities to those who have served and who have made great sacrifices for our country and freedom. This new scholarship will provide an additional way for severely injured servicemembers to accomplish their educational goals,” stated Chancellor and University founder, Henry Herzing, a veteran of the U.S. Navy.

Qualifying Criteria

- Candidates are required to complete the scholarship application prior to term start
- Candidates must submit an essay in accordance with the application to the Director of Military Education
- Currently enrolled Herzing University Students must be in good academic standing (GPA of 2.0 or greater) at time of application
- Scholarships will be distributed at a rate of up to four scholarships per semester (12 per academic year)
- Candidates may only qualify if they have a 20% or greater service-connected disability rating and an employment handicap according to the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) definition (official documentation is required for proof of status such as Purple Heart Award, or DVA document)
- Spouses and dependents of qualifying servicemembers are eligible to apply
- Candidates will be pre-screened by the Director of Military Education and officially selected by the Scholarship Review Committee
- Selected candidates may only qualify for one Henry G. Herzing \$1,000 Scholarship for Severely Injured Servicemembers award per academic year
- Candidates must demonstrate financial need
- Scholarship to be awarded in the second term of semester specified on the application; if student withdraws from classes, the scholarship will be forfeited



Henry G. Herzing Scholarship for Severely Injured Servicemembers Scholarship Application

Minimum requirements: Applicant must be pursuing a diploma or degree through Herzing University Online at full-time student status and be either a military servicemember who sustained severe injuries while serving in combat on behalf of the United States, a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces who has been honorably discharged for related reasons, -or- the spouse or dependent of a qualifying servicemember.
